Powerisk Limited("we" or "us") take your privacy seriously. This privacy policy ("**Privacy Policy**") explains the steps we take to ensure information about you is kept secure and confidential.

The information we collect

We will collect personal information about your company, which you give to us when you register to use our Services. The provision of the Services to you may also require us to store details of your transactions, together with details of your company's financial information. We will periodically review your information, to ensure that we do not keep it for longer than is necessary.

Purposes for which we use information about you

We may use your company's information for the following purposes:

Passing on information about you

If you tick the Data Protection Tick-box on the registration page for the Services, you will also be regarded as having given your consent to us disclosing your personal information to the following parties who may also provide you with information, offers and services:

- (a) other companies (both in the UK and overseas in our group of companies; and

- (b) our trusted business partners (both in the UK and overseas)- a current list of our trusted business partners is set out and is updated from time to time, current trusted business partners are Datatherapy Limited.

You can ask us to stop using your personal data for marketing purposes at any time by e-mailing our data controller, which we will do. Such a request may result in us ceasing to offer the Services to you.

Security

Keeping information about you secure is very important to us. We take security very seriously. .

However, no data transmission over the internet can be guaranteed to be totally secure. As a result, whilst we strive to protect your personal information, we cannot ensure or warrant the security of any information which you send to us, and you do so at your own risk.

Cookies

A cookie is a very small text file placed on your computer by a web browser, which has been sent by a web server. It is essentially an "identification card" relating to you. The main purpose of our cookies is to identify you when you visit our website. Each time your browser requests a web page from our server, the browser sends the information in the text file back to the server and lets the server know that you have returned to that web page. We use cookies to provide you with a better service tailored to suit you. Cookies help you to save time.
